


Delusion of the senses by Willem Broekman

Black had just played 30.b5. You can see immediately that there must be something in it for Black. The rook on c5 is unprotected. The king on g2 can be checked on d5. The pawn on b5 is attacked three times after that check. Now all that is needed are the right moves. I am suffering from delusions and think that after **30....Dd6 31.bxc6 Dxc5** the pawn via Tb4 can be stopped. That is also true. Only Black remains a pawn behind after **32.cxb7 Tb4 33.b8D Txb8 34.Dxb8+**

Of course I find out too late. Well thought out. The correct move order is: **30....axb5 31.axb5 Td5 32. Da3 cxb5** and black has (small) chances of winning.
